

# EDITORIAL

Ceventy years ago I was having a day off Jschool so as to allow room for those 2 years younger than I (including my brother) to take the 11+ exam - or "the Scholarship" as we called it then - when my mother came in waving a newspaper bearing the news of the King's death. During the following week or so a lying-in-state was held which I was greatly taken with, and would dearly love to have attended to pay respects to a much loved King who had seen us through a World War, but it was a long way to London and we did not have a car so I couldn't go. I did decide however that on the next occasion I would like to be there. I didn't realise of course how long that interval would be, and the passage of those years ("ravages" might be putting it a bit too strongly!) means that I was not able to attend this time either, for an equally (perhaps even more) loved Queen.

Sharon Coleman from Badby however was able to get to London and has written an excellent account of her visit to see the Lying-in-State. For our family's part we do have a lovely photograph of our two younger grandchildren in Green Park last Tuesday laying flowers from their garden. Their day out there made a great impression on them and I am sure that the experience and memories will live with them for a very long time.

Although we had bad luck with our nesting blue tits this year (see Links passim) we have had swallows nesting in the garage. The problem is that this pair seem to have left their breeding until very late. They did not lay their first (and so far as we are aware only) clutch until early August and as a result we had 4 lonely chicks trying to learn how to fly and feed when nearly all the other swallows have disappeared back to South Africa. Things did not look very promising for them and we hoped they would be able to leave very soon.

And then suddenly yesterday afternoon we noticed another "gathering of the clans" on the telephone wires, and by the time darkness fell they had all disappeared, together with the lonely chicks! What a blessing! I think they all decided to fly off during the night to avoid the traffic......

# THE RECTOR'S LETTER

#### Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

We have been blessed to have lived and thrived in the second Elizabethan age and to lose our beloved Queen has shaken and saddened us beyond words because, without a doubt. Elizabeth II was a unique, special and godly aueen.

The day before her death. I was in Newnham school where we were discovering who King David was in the Bible. We are told that David was a man after God's own heart, and before her coronation, the young and inexperienced Princess Elizabeth revealed that she was a woman after God's own heart when she asked her people to pray this prayer: "that God may give me

wisdom and strength to carry out the solemn promises that I shall be making and that I may faithfully serve Him, and you, all the days of my life."

Queen Elizabeth served with humility, passion, humour and graciousness every single day of her life, doing her duty and serving sacrificially until the end. Except that it isn't the end, is it? Not if we believe that she has now gone to glory; and why would we not?

Her Majesty was a Queen who sought the heart of God, the King of Kings. Her service to Commonwealth and country came from her personal commitment to follow in Christ's footsteps. To serve others as God had served her. To love and forgive as she had experienced love and forgiveness from Christ. In her 2016 Christmas address. Her Majesty boldly proclaimed, "Billions of people now follow Christ's teaching and find in him the guiding light for their lives. I am one of them"

But for the Queen, Jesus wasn't simply a teacher or leader, he was her Lord and her Saviour. Five years earlier she made that clear when, speaking of our need for salvation, she said, "God sent into the world a unique person. Neither a philosopher nor a general, important though they both are, but a Saviour with the power to forgive."

> Queen Elizabeth's heart was so full of belief that it

overflowed with love. humility and service. She pledged herself to you and to me, to the office she held and the nations that looked to her and she gave her all, to all of us

What gave her such a remarkable ability to reign with humility and

self-sacrificial servanthood? It was her deep faith. Again, in her own words she declared; "I hope that, like me, you will be comforted by the example of Jesus of Nazareth who, often in circumstances of great adversity, managed to live an outgoing, unselfish and sacrificial life ... He makes it clear that genuine human happiness and satisfaction lie more in giving than receiving; more in serving than in being served."

We can thank God, that we have been blessed by having a Queen who was unlike any before and. I dare I say, any to follow: a queen after God's own heart, a loyal servant of Him and of us; a queen who has now gone to her heavenly King.

She will rest in peace. She will rise in glory. God has saved our precious Queen.



#### KEITH BURROWS

Keith, or ALAN Keith Burrows as he was christened due to a misunderstanding between the family and the vicar, was born on 18th June 1943. He had one younger brother.

The family initially lived in a three up, two down cottage in Harlestone with an outside loo and tin bath

in front of the fire ! They had a large vegetable garden and kept chickens and pigs. A subsequent move to a brand new council house (No 6 the Green) made them feel they had won the lottery. Keith attended Harlestone Primary School from the age of four and then Duston Secondary Modern.

He was very fond of the countryside and loved to help at the local farm especially at harvest time. On leaving school he was offered a job at Rock Farm but an accident when he was just seventeen changed his life. Whist hauling 1 cwt sacks of grain up into the loft the pulley rope snapped and the sack of grain flattened him, compressing his spine. Despite manipulation, traction and many other treatments he suffered pain for the rest of his life. This unfortunately curtailed his sporting activities, however he took over as scorer for Harlestone Cricket Club and became one of the best skittle players in the league.

After a brief spell at a small engineering firm in Northampton he was involved with the setting up of the family business FWT Burrows & Co Ltd, Construction Engineers.

In 1967 Keith married Rose and they set up home together in New Duston where Neil their son was born. After a while they decided to move to Newnham where they spent the rest of their lives and where Jo their daughter completed their family. After many happy years tragedy struck once again when Rose was diagnosed with breast cancer. Following a long and painful battle she lost the fight against the disease in her early fifties. Although as time passed his grandchildren Shane, Ashley and Lewis helped to enrich his life his sad loss prompted him to fund raise for Cancer Research UK which he trelessly undertook for the rest of his life.

Keith had a keen interest in stamps and postcards and amassed a large and valuable collection. He also bred cage birds (particularly finches) and won a number of awards at local shows.

Keith was a very generous man and supported all village organisations. Newnham has once again lost one of it's many outstanding characters.

He will be sorely missed.
