If this continues they will be left with a significant level of flu vaccine which cannot be kept for another year. If you haven't had your flu vaccine and qualify for one please contact the surgery and they will fit you in with either a doctor or nurse for you to have it at the surgery.

The surgery has a contract with the Oxford University Hospitals, which includes the Horton, for them to treat patients from the medical centre. If you should experience a problem with getting treated at any of the hospitals please contact the surgery who will help resolve the situation for you.


