EDITORIAL

What a delightful afternoon at Newnham last month for Snowdrop Sunday. A wonderful display of snowdrops at The Nuttery and elsewhere, followed in the Village Hall by tea and cake and, most importantly, chats with old friends. Newnham always do us very well on these occasions, so congratulations and thanks.

There are other welcome signs of spring too (though when we went to see *Nutcracker* at Derngate last night we could have been forgiven for thinking that Christmas had come again!).

The sparrows, tits, chaffinches, goldfinches and blackbirds are singing their hearts out, and yesterday on my morning walk I heard a woodpecker at work in the spinney. It's time to get out the blue tit nesting boxes again and install the cameras - hoping for a better outcome than last year when, having raised a brood, the parents both suddenly disappeared (I blame the sparrowhawk) leaving the chicks to perish. That was heart-breaking.

The current woke obsession with trying not to run any risk of upsetting anyone under any circumstances (the latest ludicrous sufferer being Roald Dahl) is not new.

John Dyson in 1977 wrote a concise handbook for teenagers called The Motorcycle Book. It was reprinted into several foreign editions - most of them as concise as the original. However the American edition was nearly twice as long. In the English edition the author wrote "if you skid under a bus, you are dead." Brief, memorable, and to the point . Translated into American that became "if you have the misfortune to slide under an oncoming passenger transit vehicle, you are likely to suffer a terminally unpleasant experience."

The BBC news has been showing this week more harrowing footage of the dreadful destruction resulting from the Turkish/Syrian earthquakes - this time from Antakya - otherwise known as Antioch. In 2011 June and I visited Antioch where we saw, amongst other things. St. Peter's Grotto which is said to be the earliest Christian worship site, founded by St. Luke but named after Peter. We found Antioch a most beautiful city (despite having been ravaged more than once by earthquakes and wars), full of delightfully decorated buildings and mosaics, as well as of course a fascinating Souk. I have a photograph, taken by one of our companions, of me buying in the Souk some of the most delicious crystallised pumpkin and Turkish delight that I have ever tasted!

To see the splendid place which we had visited reduced to nothing more than piles of rubble was truly appalling.

The news bulletin included an exchange with a local guide, who was almost in tears, but who nonetheless was full of hope, and indeed conviction, that it would be rebuilt once again.

Which brings us to...


THE RECTOR'S LETTER

Refreshment or resentment?

I'm just enjoying a nice cup of tea.

I'm back from walking the dog on a particularly warm winter's day which feels rather spring-like and a cup of tea just hits the spot. Very refreshing.

Lent is a funny old time of year. It's often seen as a time of abstinence, or self-denial – a period of time in which we give things up. This is regarded as being good for us spiritually and I dare say that it is for many people; however, many others can simply end up with feelings of resentment, frustration and finally guilt as they give into that chocolate bar.



Treat Lent as a time to be spiritually refreshed. The Bible reminds us that we can see the hand of God around us, creation should draw us back to the creator – get out and about and enjoy the wonderful countryside that we live in or marvel at your children, grandchildren, spouse or partner.

But don't leave it there. Discover more about the creator. By all means be spiritually refreshed by his creation but then discover his love for you, his passion for your eternal wellbeing and his amazing grace and mercy. How? Why not read a bit of the Bible? I know, you'll tell me that you don't have one and that you wouldn't know where to start. Let me help you.

If you go to our website

(knightleybenefice.org.uk), scroll to the bottom of the Home Page where it says "What's On",

wait a moment for the big box that says "Church Calendar" to change to "Holy Bible" and then click on that you will find that it will open up the Bible at chapter I of John's Gospel on your PC or phone.

Why not simply read a chapter a day? There are 21 chapters in John, all of which are pretty short and, depending on when you read this and decide to give it a go, you should get through the whole gospel before Easter even allowing for a few days when you forget or don't have time – speaking of which, don't get

frustrated or feel guilty if that happens, remember this is about refreshment, not resentment.

Of course, you don't have to read John's Gospel, you could play around with the site and by clicking on the arrow next to "John 1" go to Matthew. Mark or Luke. You could even change the translation by clicking on the arrow next to "NIV" (which stands for "New International Version") – there is an Anglicised NIV which doesn't have the American spellings, for example.

So, pop the kettle on, enjoy a guilt free chocolate biscuit, enjoy your garden and be spiritually refreshed this Lent as you discover the loving creator of all that is around us






